## **Participation**

- 100 participants have shared their views
- 43 of these are artists, 16 arts participants, an 26 identify as administrators / other service professionals facilitating arts practice.
- The focus groups were established and promoted in partnership with key stakeholders such as AMNCH Tallaght, and the Arts and Disability Partnership. As such had variety of aims and have served multiple purposes.



## **Artist Focus Group Outcomes**

- to encourage the villages of Clondalkin, Lucan and the rural centres to host artists network meetings;
- to devise and programme local Arts Festivals or Community Arts Festivals, showcasing and inviting in new and more established practitioners to engage with the local communities.
- The need to network artists at a very local level;





#### **Priorities for a future focus in Youth Arts**

- Access to high quality arts experiences with professional artists.
- Opportunities for artistic development for young artists of all disciplines.
- Development of local arts clubs/workspaces appropriate to young people.
- Communication / regular information about arts events
- Opportunities to share ideas across artforms, communities and cultural backgrounds.
