

Dear Ms Colgan,

I refer to your correspondence of 26/3/14 requesting a reconfiguration of the boundaries of 3 specific housing estates so that they fall under Rowlagh Health Centre instead of Lucan Health Centre.

The Department of Social Protection is currently in the process of rolling out the Intreo model of service delivery to its customers in the Clondalkin/ Lucan/ Adamstown area. When completed (hopefully by the end of Summer 2014) the Community Welfare Service which is currently based in Rowlagh Health Centre will be moving into Clondalkin Local Office. It would therefore be more suitable and practical for the residents of these 3 estates to continue attending Lucan Health Centre.

In the longer term, it is hoped that the Community Welfare Service currently based in Lucan Health Centre will move into purpose built office accommodation in Adamstown, thus solving any access issues that may arise.
