- c. A bus service from Clondalkin to Maynooth to serve the big number of students from Clondalkin who attend NUIM.”*

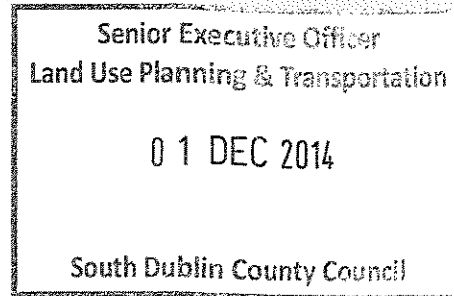


Thank you for your letters dated 18th September and the 17th October 2014 regarding requests for additional services:

- A shuttle bus service to the Luas
- A new bus service via Station Road/Palmerstown Woods/Wheatfield Prison
- A bus service from Clondalkin to Maynooth serving NUIM

All Dublin Bus resources at present are allocated to specific routes to cater for existing demand and any small growth potential. With the slight upturn in the economy which has led to customer growth on our services we will be using any additional increase in resources to improve and upgrade existing services in the first instance.

Unfortunately Dublin Bus is not in a position to introduce new services at present but will keep these proposals under review in light of developments in funding and resources.
