
Dear Mr. Kelly,

At the meeting of the Clondalkin Area Committee held on 9th December 2015 the following motion was passed by the Members:

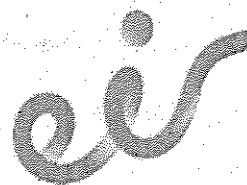
"This committee agrees to write to the owners of the disused phone box on the Boot Road asking them to remove it as soon as possible."



Dear Breda,

With reference to your letter dated 10th December 2015, REF: 46963 – Remove payphone kiosk from Boot Road Clondalkin - eir plan to recover this kiosk as soon as the ESB supply has been disconnected.

That kiosk receives its supply from a nearby pole, which is unusual. This was discovered upon a previous attempt at recovery. Typically power is underground and can be isolated thus allowing the physical recovery. However in this instance isolation is not possible and the supply must be disconnected from the grid prior to recovery.

As soon as that is complete I will schedule its physical removal.
