I would like to thank you for your letter dated 21 January 2016 regarding the motion passed by Clondalkin Area Committee on 20 January 2016 regarding a request to increase the frequency of Route 76.

Dublin Bus currently operates a twenty minute service from Chapelizod towards Tallaght (The Square) Monday to Friday on Route 76/a . Dublin Bus continuously monitors its services and we strive to operate to the published bus timetable at all times. Occasionally, due to circumstances beyond our control some Route 76/a services are curtailed due to roadworks, diversions or traffic issues.

Due to the above, Dublin Bus will review the 76/a bus schedule in mid-2016.
