Dear Ms. Clifford,

I am directed by the Minister for Justice and Equality, Ms. Frances Fitzgerald, T.D., to refer to your correspondence dated 18 March, 2016.

The Minister is aware of concerns expressed about the misuse of vehicles such as scrambler and quad bikes. In this regard, the Minister is advised by the Garda authorities that members of An Garda Síochána have the power to require a vehicle in a public place to stop under Section 109 of the Road Traffic Act 1961, and that failure by the driver to do so is an offence. The Minister is further advised that mechanically propelled vehicles (including scrambler and quad bikes) used in a public place must comply with the Road Traffic Acts, including in relation to motor tax, insurance and possession of a valid driver licence or learner permit, and that non-compliance is also an offence. In addition, a vehicle may be seized where the driver has no driving licence or learners permit, where the driver has no insurance, or where there is no motor tax paid for a period of over three months after the expiry of the road tax payable on the vehicle.

You might also note that road traffic legislation comes within the remit of the Minister for Transport, Tourism and Sport.
