I would be obliged for your comments and response as soon as possible to enable me to revert to the Committee.

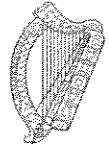

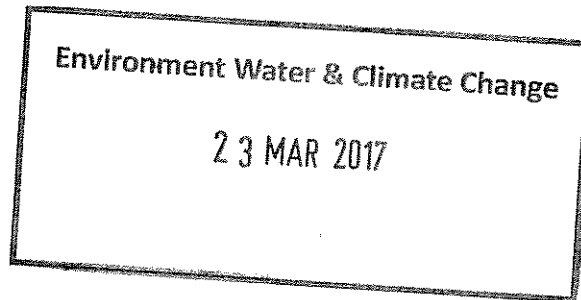
