Dear Ms. O'Reilly,

I am directed by the Tánaiste and Minister for Justice and Equality, Ms. Frances Fitzgerald T.D., to refer further to your correspondence of 18 November, 2016 and to your more recent correspondence dated 19 January, 2017.

Further enquiries were made with An Garda Síochána in relation to anti-social behaviour in the Newcastle area and the Tánaiste is advised that additional high visibility hybrid checkpoints have been carried out in recent months which has resulted in a reduction in crime and that Gardaí in Rathcoole are aware for the need to provide extra patrols in and around Newcastle.

The Tánaiste has noted the request made in relation to gangland crime. In relation to Garda resources, I hope you will appreciate that the Garda Commissioner is responsible for the distribution of resources, including personnel, among the various Garda Divisions and the Tánaiste has no direct role in the matter. The Tánaiste is assured by the Garda Commissioner that the allocation of Gardaí is continually monitored and reviewed taking into account all relevant factors including crime trends, demographics, and security assessments relating to the area in question so as to ensure optimal use is made of Garda human resources.

To be of assistance, the Tánaiste has arranged for a copy of your correspondence to be forwarded to the Garda authorities for their attention and any action deemed necessary.
