Economic, Enterprise and Tourism Development

To end August, 415 clients have attended LEO provided training, with a further 231 attending training provided by South Dublin Chamber, supported through the Business Support Fund. Construction of South Stand commenced in February 2018, with anticipated Final completion date for 19th October 2018. Seating capacity will be over 8,000 on completion. North Stand feasibility being considered, with Expressions of Interest/Fee Proposals invited on cost proposals for a design study. Library News Library Development Plan 2018 – 2022 "Open to You" South Dublin Library Plan 2018 – 2022 was formally agreed at the Council meeting. The plan is essentially a road map for the next five years with six key objectives and corresponding actions outlined. ICT Funding Approval received from the Department for grant-aid ICT Funding up to €246,677 to support the establishment of public libraries as digital learning centres and enablers of digital services. Healthy Ireland at Your Library is a key action under the new public libraries strategy Our Public Libraries 2022 Phase Two of Healthy Ireland at Your Library will run from September until 31 March 2019. Libraries are currently buying stock for phase two of the initiative for branch libraries. Summer Reading Stars Summer Stars, part of Right to Read National Literacy Initiative, was a big success with 1,666 children participating; 131,670 books issued and over 2,393 children attending events during the summer. Work Matters This is a National initiative which is being driven throughout the library branch network. Library staff continue to establish links with the ETB and LEO. Staff have received training and new brochures/promotional material are now available. Related events have been organised in branch libraries. Culture Night The County Library, Clondalkin Library and Ballyroan Library will all host events for culture night with guest speakers in the branch libraries. Redline Book Festival – booking for the festival is open with a huge programme of events planned for 8th-14th October. TEDx Ballyroan Library – tickets are selling out fast for this event to be hosted in Ballyroan Library this year. The theme this year is The Big (Re) Think and 10 speakers are lined up. The Organisation Procedures and Finance meeting was held of 20th September, following which a special Council Meeting was held to consider a nomination for a Presidential candidate. Contact had been received from 11 individuals all of whom were invited to attend the Special Meeting and 4 candidates attended and presented. The meeting passed a resolution that no nomination would be made. Preparatory work is underway on the recommended boundary changes to the local electoral areas by the Boundary Committee however implementation of any changes only commence on receipt of the Ministerial Order in accordance with Section 23 of the Local Government Act. A review of the process of receiving and responding to Members Representation is underway to ensure compliance with Section 40 of the Data Protection Act 2018, which gives legislative effect to the General Data Protection Regulations. The executive are liaising with the AILG to ensure training is provided to elected members on their responsibilities as data controllers under the act. Progress on the transfer to the voter.ie system which will replace Checktheregister.ie is ongoing with a timeline of November to February 2019 being agreed with Dublin City Council, the lead authority. User testing of the register on the system is currently underway in preparation for the transfer. The three other Dublin local authorities have already transferred over to the back-end system which is now operational as a shared service. Dublin City Council have confirmed the public-facing front portal will be completed by the end of February. A full briefing note will be provided to elected members and a public communications campaign will be launched in March. The new system is designed with significant enhancements to ensure it is a more efficient and effective way of managing the register and is significantly more user-friendly for the public.

Objective 2: Provide robust financial management, risk management, audit and corporate governance systems

The Chief Executives report for the consideration of variation of the basic rate of the Local Property Tax was presented to Council on the 3rd September, following which the members decided to reduce the local adjustment factor by 15%. Preparation of the 2019 Budget has commenced and meetings with the political groupings are being arranged. The Audit Committee met on 12th September. Items considered at the meeting included a report from the Local Government Auditor on the Audit of the 2017 Annual Financial Statement. The Chair of the Audit Committee will present on the Audit Committee's consideration of the Auditor's report to the October Council Meeting. The corporate Procurement Steering Group met on 12th September to review all procurement and management of contracts within the organisation and consider any regulatory or other developments. Training for relevant staff on e-Tenders, the Quick Quotes system and the Contracts Database was provided for by the Procurement Office. The corporate Data and Record Management Steering Group met on 17th September to review Data Protection issues and the ongoing implementation and sectoral review of the Record Retention and Management Policy.

Objective 4: Develop and maintain appropriate communication channels that enable proactive citizen engagement

The Events section of the website was updated to provide better user options and display features. A Digital Content Governance Policy is being finalised as well as guidelines on formatting consultations on the portal. The Communications team are working with the MyDoorStep team on the promotions for the new online presence and physical space in County Hall. The €300K Have Your Say Participatory Budgeting initiative in Clondalkin, held from February to June 2018, was reviewed by the Steering Group at its meeting on 5th September. A report is currently being finalised and will be circulated to all councillors once finalised. Implementation of the 24 successful projects in Clondalkin has commenced and a report on the delivery of the 8 successful Lucan projects from the 2017 initiative is being prepared, also for circulation to all councillors. Consultations held September included: 1. Proposed Social Housing Development for Older Persons, Templeogue Village at Riverside Cottages Dublin 6w. 2. Proposed Social Housing Development New Nangor Road, Clondalkin

Objective 5: Support staff and organisational development and performance through the implementation of best practice in Human Resource Management

Recruitment to fill vacancies is ongoing. including preliminary interviews for General Operatives and the formation of a panel for Clerical Officers. Delivery of the Training and Development Plan for all staff is ongoing, including the Lean Six Sigma training programme and support for the project teams in the delivery of the identified LSS projects. The final report of the Depot Review was circulated to staff and unions for agreement. The report is the outcome of a significant piece of work by an experienced external consultant encompassing both analysis of all depot operations and an extensive process of consultation and engagement of staff, management and unions over the last year. Work on the People Strategy for the sector is ongoing and South Dublin are actively involved in its development.

Environment, Water & Climate Change

Public Realm Maintenance: The 2018 Improvement Works is being implemented. Schemes commenced. A revised Maintenance Works Programme will be drawn up following completion of the Public Realm Review Process. N81 Improvement Scheme: Tendered for construction of Phase 1a of N81 Scheme. Tender deadline initially to 18th September has been extended to 28th September 2018. Tree Maintenance Programme: Tree crew are carrying out tree pruning and removals at Ashfield Estate and Sylvan Drive in Kingswood, then on to Woodville Estate in Lucan. A tender process was recently completed for remedial tree works by contract on dangerous and high risk trees. Closing date for the tender was extended to July 27th following the issuing of additional information to tenderers. Following an initial meeting was held on Sept 12th, the tender assessment is continuing. Litter Management: Environmental Awareness: Conscious Cup campaign launched in County Hall on 16th August. Community clean-ups 213. Dublin Canvas Project (Anti-Graffiti) ongoing - 2nd call for balance of utility boxes complete and will be assessment in mid-September. Radio adverts running in the square from Aug 2018 – Jan 2019 on a rotational basis for Anti-Litter, Anti-Cigarette litter & Anti- Dog Fouling. Green schools - 99 primary & 35 secondary. Green schools newsletter posted out to all schools. Green school seminar taking place Tallaght library Thursday 20th Sept. Safe Halloween promo being developed - Bulbs not Bonfires promoted from Friday 6th Sept. with significant interest. Public Realm: Cleansing Schedule continues, pickups for community clean-ups ongoing. Notices issued to clubs on a weekly basis regarding post-match clean ups. Solar Bins tender published. Ongoing servicing of Bottle banks / recycling facilities carried out. Targeted programme to remove bonfire material from public places in advance of Halloween Halloween. Letters issued to household waste collectors operating in SDCC requesting details relating to customers not utilising brown bin service – 68,783 households were provided with a Brown Bin and 48,922 households using brown bin. Surface Water Schemes: Schemes for 2018 well under way. Upgrade to the remote monitoring of the Poddle screens complete. Works in Glenmaroon complete. Works on Peamount Road complete. Works on the Pond at Rathfarnham Castle and on the SW Culvert on Stocking Lane complete. Works on Ballyowen Lane ongoing. Surveying work in Templeogue Village complete, ongoing liaison with Roads Department in relation to scheme commencement. Initial proposal to amalgamate Jetter services in the Drainage section submitted, further details requested. Drainage, Roads and Public Realm sections met, discuss and make revised proposals. Poddle - flow and rainfall survey extended. Meeting with the local stakeholders has also commenced and will continue. River Basin Plans and Measures: Launch of the Dublin Urban Rivers Life Project took place on Monday 17th September at Rathfarnham Castle. Report to September SPC. Business cases being prepared to commence recruitment process. Water Services: Repairs of leaks and Bursts by Water Operations ongoing. Mechanical Services: EWCC Climate Change section working on press release in advance of photoshoot for. 3 No. Mitsubishi Fuso Canter Pickups.

Objective 3: Manage our regulatory, licensing and enforcement roles together with the Environmental Protection Agency

Waste Enforcement Action: Enforcement / surveillance services (Litter and Waste) continues. Continued interdepartmental liaison to develop common approach to common issues. High level activity sites in Lucan area investigated with successful outcome expected. Control of Animals: Temporary Contracts for Control of Horses and Dogs rolled over pending finalisation of procurement process. Air Quality: National Clean Air Strategy launched. Regulations are currently being finalised. The ban on the sale of smoky coal which has been in place in larger towns for some time, will be extended countrywide from autumn of 2018. Dublin Noise Action Plan: The first draft of the Noise Action Plan has been finalised for Public Consultation. The latest Noise Agglomeration meeting was held on 14th September in Dublin City Council offices. Meeting of the Noise Mapping Bodies is in the EPA offices on Wednesday 19th September.

Objective 4: Maintain and improve our parks and recreation areas to enhance our quality of life

Regional and Local Parks: Proposal for new regional park maintenance structure is included in the Public Realm Review proposals. Signage erected re dogs on leads (except in dog-runs). Play-space Programme: Tender for Waterstown returned and assessed. Standstill period completed now in lead in period; due to site 15/10/2018. Tenders for multiple playspaces being issued in batches. Consultation and meetings with regard to Whitechurch completed and tender being prepared. Part 8 for Newcastle Clondalkin ACM; to commence shortly. Awaiting contract finalisation. Teen Space Consultation: Meeting with Community, Comhairle na Nog, Crosscare and Foroige completed. Intensive Teenage workshops to be arranged. Report of preliminary findings of teenage survey with draft recommendations presented to May Council Meeting. Pilot projects being planned. Recreational and Sporting Facilities: Hermitage Frame Football project opened 15/09/2018. Pavilion Programme: QS tendered for and construction tender process underway. Dodder Valley Mt Carmel; ogham tree trail, signage in lead in period, tree supply out to tender. Site investigations completed. Delivery of objectives in the Tourism Strategy Corkagh Park Recreational Project re-tender for consultants underway and will issue shortly.
