Land Use Planning & Transportation

Objective 1: Implement an Annual Road Works Programme of maintenance and improvements

• Roadworks and Footpath Programme: Tendering for the agreed projects is almost complete and work has now commenced on 80% of projects. • Tenders: Tenders have been run for JCB's, Removal and Disposal of Construction and Demolition Waste and Jetter services. • Programme C LED Upgrade – projection to end Q4 2019 – 2,000 upgrades. • Regional Road LED Upgrade (RRU) Programme 2019 - R148 and R120 LED Upgrade in progress. Due for completion at end of Q3. • TII: Works on N81 are complete • SIAC have been appointed to deliver a programme of 54 traffic calming projects across the County, these works are due to start on site shortly and will be complete by the end of the year

Objective 2: Maintain a professional planning and development management structure and processes

•The Tallaght Town Centre Local Area Plan is currently being prepared, with the intention of going on public display later in the summer. The Local Area Plan will be a 6 year planning framework, providing a clear vision and a series of objectives, which will shape the future development of Tallaght. •With the adoption of the Regional Spatial Economic Strategy for the Eastern and Midland region, a review of the County Development Plan is being undertaken in order to ensure full compliance with both National and Regional policy. •Strategic Housing Development, there are a total of 36 applications in the system. Active pre-planning meetings on 16 sites are ongoing with the Council under Section 247 of the Act. The Council is also engaging in tripartite meetings with developers and ABP, as required under the Planning and Development (Housing) and Residential Tenancies Act 2016. On the 19th June ABP agreed with the opinion of the Council and refused an application for permission by Bartra for 150 build to rent and 222 shared living units in Cookstown. The reasons for refusal related to the application not being 'plan-led' and to the poor format of the shared accommodation, which, it was considered would not provide an acceptable living environment to future residents. A second application in Cookstown, the Pyrmont site for 196 build to rent apartments beside the Cookstown Luas stop is due for decision on the 8th August.

Objective 3: Promote all modes of transport including walking and cycling to improve the movement of people within and beyond the county

R120 new road. Following completion by ESB of their on-road works, a Certificate of Substantial Completion has issued to the Contractor which states that the works were substantially complete on 10th June 2019. The Contractor will complete minor outstanding works and carry out snagging during the Maintenance Defects Period which runs for 1 year from the date of Substantial Completion. The Contractor must submit his Final Account within 2 months of the date of Substantial Completion. The NTA has allocated €4.01 Million to SDDC this year to progress work on 15 Sustainable Transport Measures across the County. Design work is now underway on several projects. The main schemes are as follows; • Tallaght to Ballyboden (Scholarstown Road section) now complete, all Road Safety Audits now complete, Comparative Safety Report now complete. Ongoing monitoring of the junction being maintained. • Works on Bawnogue Permeability scheme commenced in May and are expected to complete in July. Unforeseen drainage issues being resolved • DM Morris are the successful Tenderer on Monastery Road. Works will commence in July 2019. • Fortunestown Junction upgrade complete, snagging underway. Final Account agreed. Agreement to be reached with Citywest for works carried out at the junction for them. Currently attending to works identified in RSA3 • Belgard to Cookstown Link Part 8 adopted at Council Meeting February 2018, Detailed design completed, Tender documents issued to the Kerry Framework. Latest date for receipt of Tenders is 02 July 2019 • Celbridge Link Road [LIHAF] Part 8 was adopted at the March 2018 Council Meeting. Detailed Design ongoing, construction to commence in Autumn. • Dodder Greenway progressing to finalised detailed design and tender stage with construction expected to commence on bridges this year. Bridge extents agreed. Knotweed encountered at 1 no bridge site and also at one

location between bridges – removal proposals being examined. SAQ published on 11 June 2019. • Wellington Lane consultants appointed. Options Report completed., Finalising Preliminary Design, preparing for public consultation process. • N81 Walking and Cycling (Jobstown). Consultant appointed (DBFL). Co-ordination of project between Public Realm and Roads arranged. Preliminary Design commenced. Consultant's programme awaited to bring scheme to Tender award. Consultant to ensure design satisfies Roads, Public Realm and NTA • Grange Road. Awaiting clarification from ESB of their cost estimate for undergrounding their existing overhead services and NTA approval required for these costs.

Environment, Water & Climate Change

Objective 1: Improve the appearance of our county in the interest of economic development

Public Realm Maintenance: A detailed programme of Improvement Works is underway with a number of schemes at procurement and construction phases. N81 Improvement Scheme: Phase 1a) of N81 scheme underway. Phase 1b) tender documents being finalised for tender to the framework. Art tender drafted for approval. Tree Maintenance Programme: Tree crew concluding tree maintenance in Alpine Heights. The crew will then move to Ashwood. Tree crews south N7 are completing works in Belgard Heights and will be moving to Glendown Avenue. Stump grinding will commence when the modifications to the machine are completed. Dangerous trees surveyed by independent surveyor are being inspected Taobh na Coille. 8 large mature trees will be removed, and 11 trees pruned. Scheduled Street Cleaning Programme: Street cleaning contract is carried out on behalf of SDCC by Oxigen, the delivery of this service is monitored by SDCC. Objective 2: Incorporate environmental sustainability in all policy-making and implementation programmes

Climate Change: Draft CCAP is being reviewed for publication in mid-July. Climate Action Steering Group (CASG) meeting to take place on 27th June. The CASG is tasked with the governance of delivering the CCAP. A SDCC 3 minute video, and 5 x 10 seconds videos, highlighting the actions, Projects and Initiatives that South Dublin County Council has completed, ongoing and planned across the six action areas, referencing the key challenges facing the Council, while being meaningful to all citizens. One application for financial support from the CAT fund has been applied for under Action 21 of Resource Management by Public Realm, this application is for water fountains and has been approved. Eastern/Midlands Regional WMP & WERLA: Ongoing inspection of Household Waste Bye Laws.

Anti-Dumping Initiative Projects have been approved. Surface Water Schemes: 2019 SW Minor Works Programme adopted by the Council and currently being delivered. Flood Alleviation Schemes: Poddle: EIAR nearing completion. ICW to be included in Tymon Park to improve water quality and Biodiversity. Whitechurch Stream: Section 177AE planning rather than a Part 8 planning procedure being examined. Topographic, CCTV and Utility Surveys expected to be completed by 27th June. Camac: Tender assessment board sat on 24/04/19 and preferred bidder identified. Tender Clarification letter has been issued to approved bidder, DCC are currently awaiting a response. River Basin Plans and Measures: Urban Rivers Life Project ongoing. The first EU Monitor occurred on 14th May. A report on the projects performance will be issued before the end of July 2019. The Water Pollution Section is currently selecting dwellings for septic tank inspections and farms for inspection in the Upper Griffeen catchment for 2019 as basic measures of the River Basin Management Plan and complimentary to the DURL project. Water Services: Repairs of leaks and bursts by Water Operations ongoing. Annual Service Plan and Budget agreed with Irish Water for 2019. Dublin Leakage Regional Programme ongoing.

Objective 3: Manage our regulatory, licensing and enforcement roles together with the Environmental Protection Agency

Waste Enforcement Action: Waste Management Bye-Laws 2018, #Councils4ClimateAction, Dublincanvas, stop food waste, trifocal food waste seminar dashboard dining campaign, Green dog walkers advertised out again through the newsletter/ social media. Extra poop bags distributed to all libraries with stands in them. Dublin Waste to Energy Facility: A note has issued from Dublin City Council informing the Dublin Local Authorities on the proposed increase in the annual throughput at the Dublin Waste to Energy facility. Dublin Waste to Energy Limited advised the City Council that it intends to seek a review of the licence granted by the EPA, with a view to increasing the permitted annual quantity of waste that can be accepted and treated at the facility from 600,000tpa to 690,000tpa. Control of Animals: 0 Horses seized Under the Control of Dogs legislation there were three 10 day notices issued. Air Quality: Discussions took place with the EPA in relation to a change in the monitoring of the Air Quality site at the Old Bawn - Site being upgraded to give on-line live monitoring results for PM10. It will also see a ramping up of the plan to get motorists to switch from diesel and petrol vehicle cars to hybrids and all electric. Dublin Noise Action Plan: The completed South Dublin Noise Action Plan is now fully completed and accepted by the full Council. The next stage is the creation of Quiet Area in the county and the formulation of action plans particularly in relation to construction of dwellings along major trafficked routes. Our key issues in South Dublin continue to address any areas of noise hot spots and also to assess if our public parks or parts of such parks could be deemed to be recommended as Quiet Areas or Relatively Quiet areas by Ministerial approval.

Objective 4: Maintain and improve our parks and recreation areas to enhance our quality of life

Regional and Local Parks: Park maintenance arrangements will remain in place until Public Realm Review can be implemented. Play-space Programme: Bancroft Park, Willsbrook Park, Tymon Limekiln, Whitechurch and Glendown recently opened and very popular. Waterstown Park playground opened as part of PB2017 projects. €24,000 received as part of DCYA grant to augment this playground. Further play spaces are various stages of design, tendering and construction and will be coming on stream over the coming weeks. Lucan Demesne playspace is now open. Perrystown has been tendered and a contractor appointed and due to commence in July. Ballymount Park playspace commencing this Friday 21st June. Proposals for play spaces at Newcastle being progressed separately with Dept. of Education and a developer. Newcastle Part 8 underway Recreational and Sporting Facilities: Pavilions programme, Old Bawn Pavilion construction to commence July. Dodder Valley Mt Carmel: Phase 1 Ogham Tree trail tree completed. Phase 2 athletics track and pitch detailed design and tender docs being completed, tender underway. Phase 3: Playground part 8 2019. Draft design underway. Tender for EIA AA underway. Delivery of LIHAF Funded: Airlie Park: Planning granted, tender for consultants returned and tender assessment completed and is at design stage. Tandy's Lane Park: Consultants engaged. Detailed design underway. Delivery of Sports Pitch Strategy: Sports Pitch Strategy underway. This project will allow the development of a strategy to guide the development, construction and management of sports pitches and pitch-based recreation county-wide.

Corporate Performance and Change Management

Objective 1: Support local democracy including the policy making and representation role of our Elected Members - Induction training for councillors held on June 10th, 19th & 21st and further session to be confirmed. Training on Chairing meetings being scheduled for Mayor, ACM and SPC chairs. - Inaugural annual meeting and OP & F have taken place with all statutory nominations completed and will be notified to bodies following final ratification at the July Council meeting. - Marked Register data protection issue raised and being examined. - Polling scheme timeline including consultation has been finalised, for completion by year end. - New Area Cttee co-ordinators are being appointed this week and a meeting / briefing session will be scheduled. - Timelines for the preparation of the new SPC Scheme and Corporate Plan 2020 – 2024 are being finalised this week for discussion at the July CPG following which the public consultation will commence. Councillor preferences and nominations from the pillars for the SPCs will take place in July so that meetings can be convened in September following the adoption of the new scheme at the September Council meeting.

Objective 2: Provide robust financial management, risk management, audit and corporate governance systems

- The Quarter 1 financial returns were prepared and submitted to the Department in accordance with their requirements. The Councils Revenue Account showed an excess income over expenditure of €4.5m for the quarter and the Councils Capital Account has improved by €5.3m. This issue is a special publication featuring South Dublin County Council's 25 years of serving the county. - The very successful Flavours of South Dublin festival was held on Sunday 23rd June. - The Annual Report for 2018 has been published in English and Irish. - Preparations were underway throughout June on updating intranet content for the launch of a newly designed intranet on 26 June. - Full plans for 25 Years celebrations were discussed at the OP&F meeting and are being finalised. - Irish Language Scheme consultation is currently open, with the draft of the fourth scheme intended to be ready for approval at September Council's meeting. - Steering Group members for the €300K Have Your Say participatory budgeting initiative have been agreed. The LEA for the 2019 iteration will be selected at the July Council meeting. Reports to Clondalkin and Lucan ACM on completion of previous projects are ongoing.

Objective 5: Support staff and organisational development and performance through the implementation of best practice in Human Resource Management

Grange Castle Business Park employment figures are now circa 5328 (incl construction).
Tallaght Stadium is being promoted as a location of choice for business events. Architects Dept preparing tender documents for Design Architects for Part 8 process, with Project to proceed to Part 8 in Q3, 2019.
Tallaght Stadium was a host venue for the UEFA U/17 European Championship, during May, with 7 games being played in Tallaght, including the final on 19th May. Approx 20,000 spectators attended the matches in Tallaght Stadium.
Housing Department continuing to look at developing housing on SDCC owned land through Part 8 process, including Riversdale (Part 8 approved), Kilmartin/Fettercairn, Killinarden, Old Lucan Rd, & Balgaddy.

Objective 4: Maximise the contribution of arts, libraries, heritage and the Irish language to quality of life and our tourism experience

ABP have advised that an Oral Hearing will take place on the application for the proposed development. The requested bird survey has been completed by the consultants and will be submitted to An Bord Pleanála before 30th September. The Oral Hearing concluded on Tueaday 27th November. A decision is not expected until April 2019. On 6th February 2019, An Bord Pleanála issued another further information request with a response date of no later than 7th February 2020.
