Dear Mr McAdam

Thank you for your correspondence on behalf of South Dublin County Council.

The proposal for an import terminal for Liquefied Natural Gas has been on the EU's list of infrastructural Project of Common European Interest for six years now. An LNG terminal would enhance Ireland's security of supply by increasing import route diversity, particularly as our indigenous gas from the Corrib field continues to deplete.

Natural gas currently provides approximately 39% of Ireland's energy needs, generating over 50% of the electricity we use. In total there are over 700,000 gas customers, including approximately 30,000 businesses. Natural gas is an important fuel for the transition from coal, peat and oil to renewable sources. As we transition to a low carbon economy, stand-by capacity will continue to be needed when renewable sources are not available on the grid. Gas powered generation provides important necessary back-up capacity when generation from intermittent renewable sources are not available on the grid.

I have initiated a review of sustainability and security of supply to evaluate all of the options that can best ensure that we can make the transition to renewable energy quickly and safely.
