

Addendum to Screening Statement for Appropriate Assessment

Lucan Public Realm

Liffey Promenade & Demesne Park Entrance

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1.0 INTRODUCTION

South Dublin County Council have commission Doherty Environmental Consultants (DEC) Ltd. to complete a Stage 1 Screening for Appropriate Assessment for proposed public realm enhancement works to the Liffey Promenade and Demesne Park Entrance, Lucan, Co. Dublin. The Screening Report for Appropriate Assessment for the proposed public realm enhancement works was finalised in December 2021 and accompanied the Part VIII planning application.

Following the completion of the period of consultation and public display all submissions received on foot of the public consultation period were reviewed by South Dublin County Council and the Chief Executive's response to submissions received have been detailed in the Part 8 Report prepared and finalised by South Dublin County Council in April 2022.

Following consideration of the submissions received the Chief Executive has introduced a number of amendments to the proposed public realm enhancement works at the Liffey Promenade and the Demesne Park Entrance. The following section provides a summary of the submission received, the Chief Executive's amendments to the proposed public realm works arising out of the submission received and a screening of the proposed amendments for their potential to result in likely significant effects to European Sites.

2.0 EXAMINATION OF THE CHIEF EXECUTIVE'S AMENDMENTS

The Chief Executive's amendments to the submissions received following the consultation period for the proposed public realm works at the Liffey Promenade and the Demesne Park Entrance are outlined in Table 2.1 and Table 2.2 below. An examination of the potential for these amendments to the proposed public realm works is also provided in Table 2.1 and Table 2.2.

3.0 CONCLUSION

The Chief Executives amendments to the proposed public realm works at the Liffey Promenade and the Demesne Park Entrance will represent minor alterations to the proposed public realm works in the context of the overall works and the existing urban environment at Lucan village. The screening exercise for the Part VIII planning application identified an absence of any function impact pathway connecting the footprint of the proposed public realm works to European Sites in the wider surrounding areas and also noted that all European Sites occurring in the wider surrounding area are located at a remote distance from the proposed public realm works location. In light of the above it is the considered view of the author of this screening addendum for Appropriate Assessment that it can be concluded by South Dublin County Council that the Chief Executive Amendments are not likely, alone or in-combination with other plans or projects, to have a significant effect on any European Sites in view of their Conservation Objectives and on the basis of best scientific evidence and there is no reasonable scientific doubt as to that conclusion.

Accordingly, the competent authority is enabled to determine that it can be excluded, on the basis of objective information, that the Chief Executive amendments, individually or in combination with all other elements of the proposed proposed public realm works as well as other plans or projects, will have a significant effect on any European Site.
