


Library Usage comparison

- Our school visits have increased from on average 1-2 classes per week in Sept 2022 to 7-8 classes per week in April 2023. This in an increase of from approximately 50 students to 200 students per week.

- For teens a new 3 week course started on Sat 6th May on how to make 3D Computer Games with Inventors Club. The teenage category is one we want to focus on more with secondary schools. We are currently putting together a programme of author visits and talks for secondary schools from Sept onwards.
- 25th May we have storytelling session in the Round Tower Garden with storyteller Roisin Murphy on Celtic Myths and Legends. Currently we have 80 school children booked in for this event.
- 26th May we will have a talk by Liz Gillis on The Local Story: the Irish Revolution in Clondalkin for primary school children.

• Nature, Nature, Everywhere.....

In June we will introduce a new 4-part nature based workshop for school children with visual artist Sinead Curran.

These workshop integrates techniques to help access and express emotions, relaxing the children into art practice, both outdoors and inside using textile, printmaking and photography techniques.

Mobile Libraries Highlights

- The Mobile Library visited 132 public stops in April where we welcomed 2277 visitors. We made eight visits to primary schools in April either side of the schools Easter holidays.
- Our Library@Home service continues to deliver books to vulnerable people in the community and we made 108 home deliveries in April. We held a further nine outreach events in April, including our regular monthly visit to Ukrainian refugees at Citywest Hotel, and a visit to the Easter camp at Balgaddy Community Centre. For May, we also introduced a new regular outreach visit to the transit hub at Citywest Convention Centre.
