

National Initiatives

We are currently promoting two national summer initiatives at the library including:

Little Library Bags:

Each child starting school will be gifted with a bag of books to collect. The stories in the books are about starting school, being happy in yourself, and making friends.

Summer Stars:

Summer Stars is the free national reading programme for children that takes place in all public libraries and online each summer. It runs from 12th June - 31st August 2023.





Mobile Libraries Highlights

- The Mobile Libraries visited 152 publics stops in May and welcomed 2962 visitors. We made 16 visits to primary schools. Our Library@Home service continues to deliver books to vulnerable people in the community and 105 home deliveries were made in May. We held a further 11 outreach events in May including 4 creche visits, 3 afterschool club vistis, the regular monthly visit to the Ukrainian refugee centre at Citywest, and a new monthly visit to the Transit Hub at Citywest which was very successful, with over 50 residents joining the library on the day.
- The Mobiles schedule is filling up for the summer, with morning parks visits in July and August, and Saturday events at the markets in Tymon Park. We'll also be at the Dublin Pride Parade on 24th June and the Community Services Day in the Square on 22nd July.
