



Dodder Greenway - Phase 4

The Dodder Greenway walking and cycling scheme is well underway with the current phase in Rathfarnham nearing completion and is planned to be finished by the end of the year.

This section will see the milestone achieved of linking Kilvere Park behind Rathfarnham Shopping Center to Elys Arch with the route passing around the perimeter of Bushy Park, through Rathfarnham Junction and down Dodder Road Lower to the County boundary at Ely's Arch (Orwell Park).

The facilities include new pedestrian footpaths, grade separated 2-way cycling with a protective kerb from vehicles as well as traffic calming measures and public realm additions.

Early in the new year work is scheduled to commence on the next phase of the project to link Kilvere Park to Dodder Valley Park along Butterfield Avenue and Firhouse Road West.



Residential Zoned Land Tax

The Government's Housing For All – A New Housing Plan for Ireland, proposed a new tax to activate vacant land for residential purposes as a part of the Pathway to increasing new Housing Supply. The Residential Zoned Land Tax was introduced in the Finance Act 2021. The process to identify land to which the tax applies has been underway since 2022 and a the final map will be published on the 1st December 2023.

The Finance Act 2021 set out that the tax was to be payable from 2024 and collected by the Revenue Commissioners. However, the most recent Budget has changed the liability date so that the tax payable has now been deferred to 2025.

Consultation for works to Grange Castle Road Clonburris SDZ

The public consultation stage of the proposed traffic calming works to the Grange Castle Road at Clonburris are currently progressing. The proposed works are located adjacent to the Kishoge Railway Station and within the wider Clonburris Strategic Development Zone (SDZ). Traffic calming works have been proposed to accomodate the works, under Section 38 of the Roads Act (as amended).

The aim of this scheme is to reduce traffic speeds, provide safe pedestrian crossings accommodate vulnerable road users and those with reduced mobility, Improve accessibile car parking for Kishoge Train Station to coincide with the opening of the Train Station and development of this area in line with the Clonburris SDZ Planning Scheme.

The extent of works is over c.480m and primarily consists of:

- Removal of one lane of traffic each way and retention of one lane for traffic and one lane for public transport each way with markings, tactiles and signage for footpaths/cycle tracks on both sides
- New Road Markings, Installation of traffic signals
- Increased concrete footpath build outs, Kerb cuts, ramp accesses and small sections of footpath to connect into existing footpath
- Removal of concrete median barrier at junctions
- Removal of metal vehicle restraint barriers, north and south of the bridge
- Provision of approx. 60no. car parking spaces

Bus Connects at Hazelhatch

Together with the NTA and Kildare, we are working to improve safety and allow the proposed W6 Bus Route to pass through the narrow approaches and across the Hazelhatch railway bridge to increase bus frequency between Tallaght, Citywest, Celbridge and Maynooth. A public consultation was held from Thursday 20th July to Thursday 18th August 2023 and resulted in 23 submissions. 61% of respondents expressed support for the scheme while 26% of respondents expressed support for the scheme with minor amendments. The next step is detailed design and

SDCC Health and Wellbeing Initiative

Mayor Cllr Alan Edge launched the Community Services inaugural Health and Wellbeing initiative on Tuesday 17th October in Ballyroan Community and Youth Centre. The initiative is being delivered in community centres in South Dublin County Council's administrative area.

The programme which will run for eight weeks will include activities such as Meditation, Tai Chi, Crime Prevention, Mindfulness, Yoga, Winter Planting, and Nature Walks.

Ballyroan Community and Youth Centre were delighted to host the initial session, which was delivered by Firhouse native Feebee Foran, founder of Forager.ie.

Feebee presented to an audience consisting of members of the Ballyroan Active Age group, men's shed, and Templeogue women's shed. Feebee, an expert in herbal products, delivered a talk on natural remedies made with common plants and weeds, whilst also focusing on the link between nature and wellbeing.



Private Rental Inspections

appointed as the inspections company for Private Rented Inspections within the administrative area of South County Dublin. We are dedicated to improving the living housing in our administrative area through proactive basis and also in response to complaints from members of the public and on properties that are managed by an Approved Housing Body (AHB), are part of the Rental Accommodation Scheme (RAS) Payment (HAP). If a property passes, the next inspection will be in four years (typical inspection cycle) or if a new tenancy begins, whichever is sooner.

Affordable Purchase Homes at Parkleigh, Seven Mills

25, three-bedroom houses are being offered for sale under an affordable dwelling purchase arrangement in Parkleigh, Seven Mills, Clonburris. These homes are (subject to exceptions) being made available for first-time buyers only and will be sold for a price lower than market value.

This price will be linked to the applicant(s) income, savings where relevant, and mortgage capacity. The min and max price payable are based on the market value as set out in the table (right). Applicants must register on the Council's Housing Online (HOL) system before applying which is open for new registrations. The portal for applications will be open from 12pm Friday 24th Nov to 4pm Friday 15th Dec.

Think Big Space

Our proud tradition of innovation continues through enhancing our Libraries STEAM programs with cutting-edge offerings. Think Big Space, a groundbreaking collaboration between AWS (Amazon Web Services) and South Dublin County Council, launched in 2022, reshaping libraries approach to community engagement in digital education.

Think Big Space has seen 5,000 children pass through workshops in Lego Robotics and Virtual Reality, while 200+ teachers, 30+ schools, and 1,500+ students have availed of follow up visits to Tallaght Library.

Through interactions with local schools we have discovered that for a large percent of school children, that visit will be the first time that they have been in a public library. This represents a huge opportunity to grow patron numbers amongst young people, but it also allows interaction with children and teachers who may not be familiar with what services the library offers.

This initiative not only introduces youngsters to libraries but also highlights our passion for STEAM education, making South Dublin Libraries a beacon of innovation.

The introduction of 'The Loft,' a tailormade space for teenagers, stands as a testament to our commitment, marking a significant milestone in our journey. With Think Big Space having recently won the innovation award for Excellence in Local Government Awards, the launch of 'The Loft' space in County Library and the roll-out of the Libraries Steam programme, the future of library services in the County couldn't be more exciting.

Health and Wellbeing for SDCC Staff

Council staff attended a Safety and Wellbeing Seminar in the Civic Theatre, to coincide with European Week for Safety and Health at Work which runs through the week beginning October 23rd. The event was well attended by staff across the organisation and this year we were delighted to welcome back Theatre at Work (TAW) to apply their theatre-based techniques to real workplace situations. Patricia Murray, Senior Psychologist from the Health and Safety Authority addressed staff and reminded us that mental, as well as physical safety is covered by the Safety, Health and Welfare at Work Act 2005 emphasising that bullying can lead to mental ill-health.

European Week for Safety and Health at Work is an annual event that aims to raise awareness of occupational safety and health issues in Europe. It is part of the Healthy Workplaces Campaigns organised by the European Agency for Safety and Health at Work and is used as an ideal opportunity to raise awareness of the importance of active, participative workplace safety and health.

The Wellbeing team within the HR Department have also developed a Workplace Mental Health Policy to supplement SDCC's Health and Wellbeing Plan, which is committed to understanding that mental health is impacted on by a range of factors, including the working environment and workplace relationships with others. This policy promotes the values that inform behaviour in relation to mental health and which mirror SDCC's organisational values, including respect, equality and consideration for all. To help support these values, we are delighted to have secured funding from Healthy Ireland to put in place a Workplace Wellbeing Champion programme to support the

Wellbeing Strategy.

All of this supports the evidence that a healthy and happy workforce is a more productive workforce.

WAM Graduate Programme

New graduate roles are being filled through the WAM (Willing Able Mentoring) Programme which will offer paid, mentored, work placements exclusively for Level 6 (on the National Oualification Framework) graduates with disabilities, in partnership with AHEAD. AHEAD is an independent non-profit organisation creating inclusive environments in education and employment for people with disabilities. For graduates, WAM offers valuable experience in a real work setting (relevant to qualifications) and assists in the development of social and networking skills all the while receiving ongoing support and guidance in the form of a mentoring program.

For the Council, the Graduate Placement role is a key support position within the Council and the successful candidates will be assigned to Corporate Performance and Change Management. AHEAD advertised on behalf of SDCC in September 2023 and received applications for Data Analyst and Digital Marketing Graduates. Interviews are scheduled to take place in late November with the onboarding of candidates to commence in January 2024. SDCC look forward to working with AHEAD and hopefully expanding the programme in the years ahead!


Safe Fun at Halloween

Killinarden Park Masterplan Work Commences

Clonmel Enterprises Ltd have been appointed to construct the works approved by the Council under the Killinarden Masterplan Part 8. The vision for the project is to create an • Installation of CCTV. inviting, safe and engaging space for the community, while ensuring the park connects to the wider open space network of the county; the following is planned: A strategic walking and cycling route along the Whitestown Stream, with enhanced entrances, a walking / exercise circuit of 1km in length and retaining and resurfacing the existing secondary footpath network where required.

- Upgrade and replacement of the park perimeter boundary where required.
- A play trail, two natural play areas, nearby seating / social areas, a Multi-Use Games Area with

teenspace and upgrade of existing grass pitches.

- Biodiversity and Landscape improvements.

The National Transport Authority have committed substantial funding to enable delivery of the active travel element of the proposals through the park. The remaining budget is being provided through SDCC's capital budget with upgrade of the pitches being part funded through the Government of Ireland's Sports Capital Grant programme. Construction work is expected to take approximately 12 months, with an establishment period thereafter for the pitches. SDCC will seek to minimise impacts to our park users and neighbours and apologise in advance for expected

- Airlie Park, Adamstown (construction underway with completion imminent)
- Location east of the M50, planning process currently underway.
- Clonburris SDZ, Clondalkin and Lucan: (planned within SDZ area)
- West of the county (site feasibility study to progress in 2024).

The Council have provided funding for the delivery of this innovative programme and we are supported by the Department of Housing, Local Government and Heritage through the Urban Regeneratioon Development Fund for the pitch at Sean Walsh Park, and through the Local Infrastructure • Housing Actoivation Fund for Airlie Park.. Funding has also been made available via LIHAF (Airlie Park). Sean Walsh Park 3G Artificial Grass Pitch is funded by the Council and an Urban Form Development Framework grant via the National Planning Framework and the Department of Housing, Local

Government and Heritage.

The pitch booking fee is competitively priced to support our local teams and community and to facilitate an increase in active recreational use.

Local clubs that have indicated an interest in using the pitch have been contacted with a reserved time slots made available to them for booking.

Innovation in Citizen Engagement: The Loft, Tallaght Library

Staff from the South Dublin Libraries team launched The Loft; A Space for Teens in June 2023. This is a "chill out" space for young people with pool tables, charging points and games. It also plays host to DJ workshops and comedy clubs. The Loft offers teenagers a space to meet and connect with their peers in a safe space.

Innovation in Service Delivery: Developed by Rob Jameson, our **Teenspace**

This award was won by a Senior Executive Park Superintendent, who together with his team has delivered the immensely successful Teenspace programme. These facilities have real benefits for young people's physical and mental wellbeing and in terms of giving them a space to be themselves in our parks, without being moved along. South Dublin now has teenspaces in 6 locations with progress on another 8 sites ongoing.

Science, technology. engineering, art and music (STEAM) subjects are recognised as giving children the opportunity to develop their co-ordination, collaboration and co-operation skills in a fun and relaxed way. These workshops have proven enormously successful in the community and demonstrate our commitment to providing innovative,





to the highest possible standard with minimum impact, to enable scheduled fixtures and the continuing operation of the stadium throughout the works. Sincere thanks to ABM for their work on the project and in delivering a state of the art piece of social infrastructure for the local community.

Tallaght Stadium is home to the FAI Women's national football team, the FAI men's under 21 football team and of course the recently crowned, four in a row, SSE Artricity League Champions Shamrock Rovers, who play all their home games at the venue.


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


