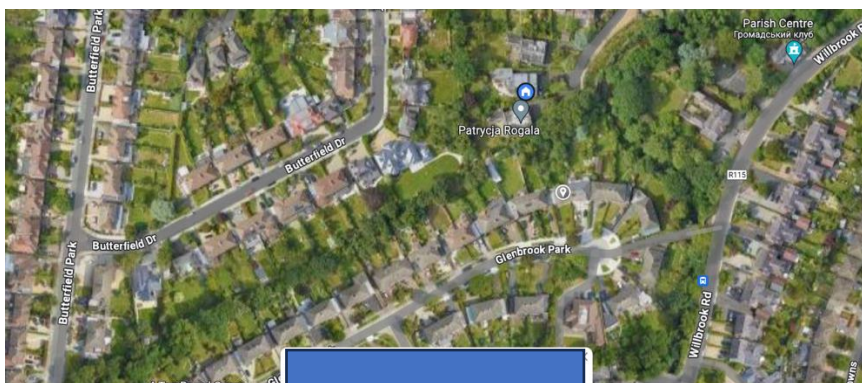
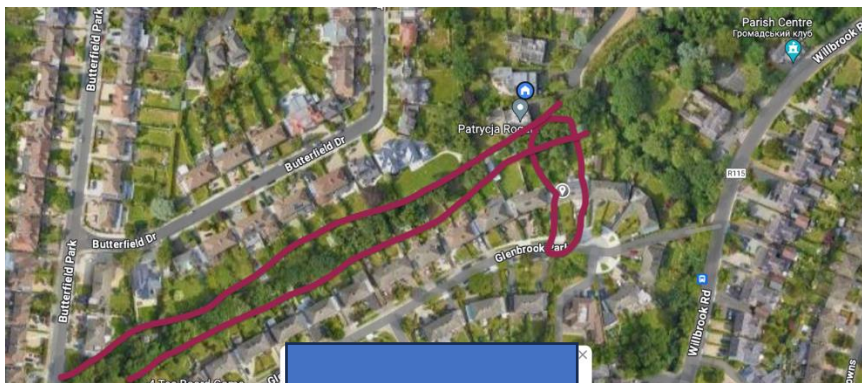
1. invading right of way lane (as per photos below)

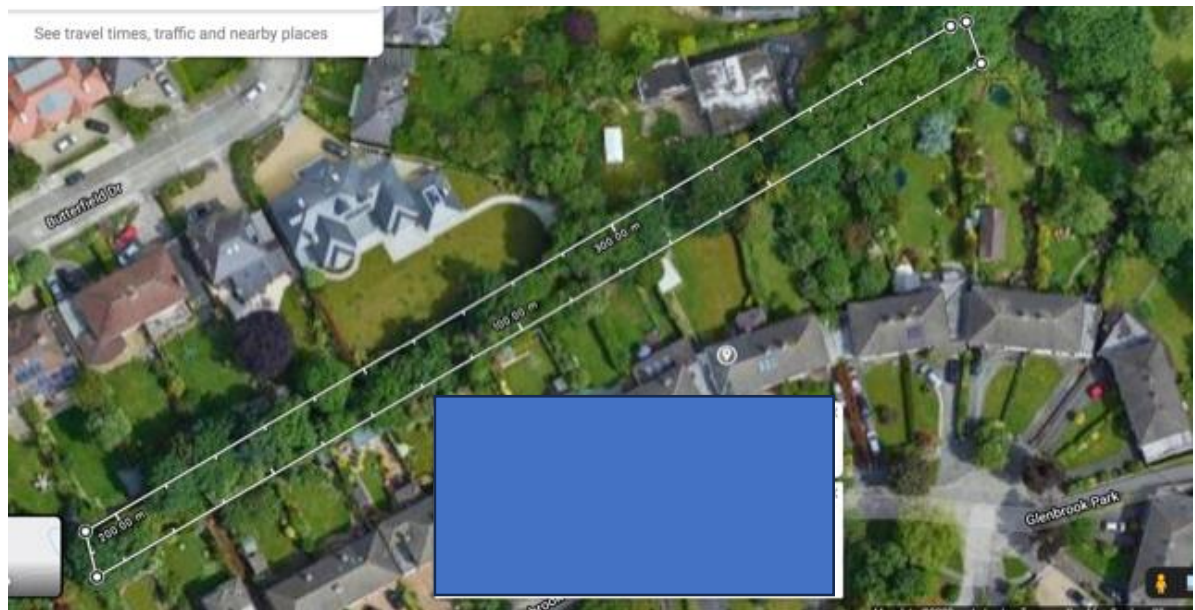
This lane is at least 10-12 m wide and 500 long connecting Owendore Avenue and Butterfield Park. Mature trees were shelter for many animals and birds all year round, much of it now removed.

Despite SDCC, Tree council Garda & Wild Life Ranger being contacted nothing is being done despite Wild Life Act 1994 and cutting mature trees in nesting this season (home for many birds in the area)

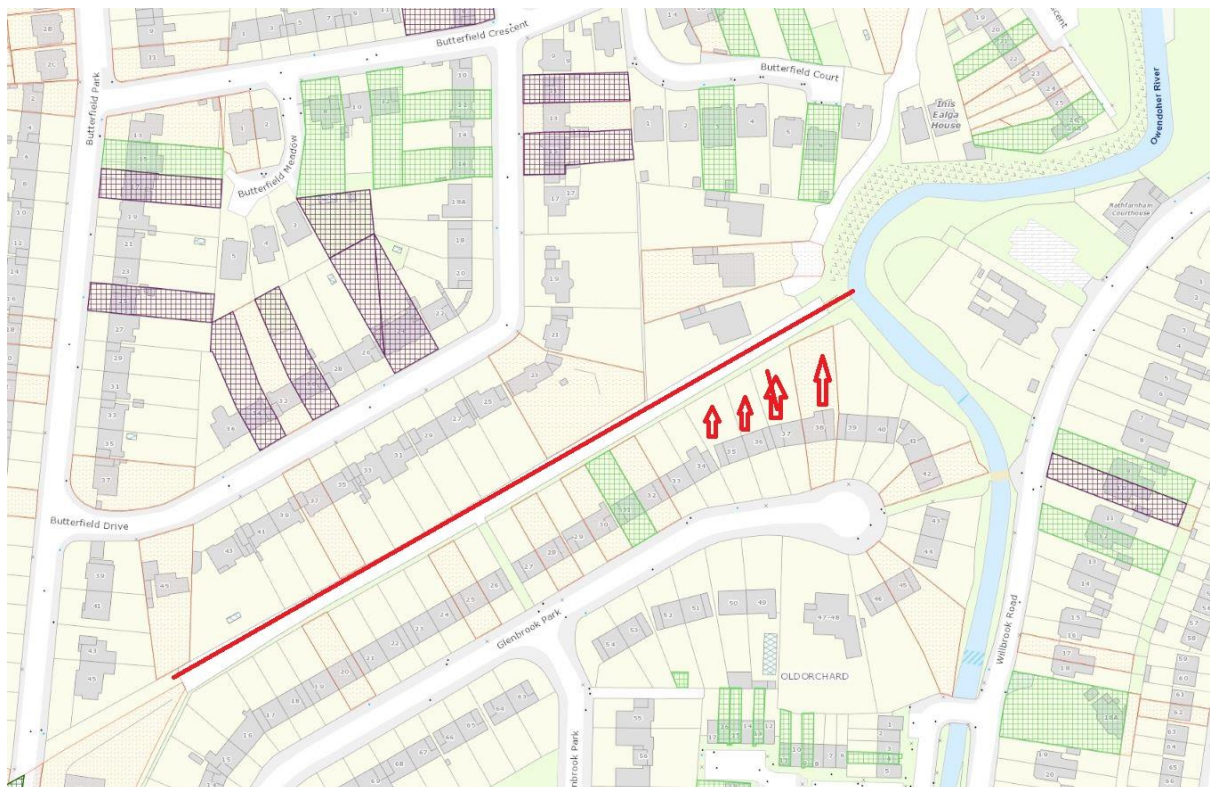
According to the land registry this lane is not in charge of council and technically “no man’s land”. Lane marked in red is right of way.
