

MARCH HIGHLIGHTS

- We continued our successful STEAM events with 2 per month, including 1 STEAM event for those with additional needs, both of which carry on into April.
- Library Labs: Engineers' Week was a great success with three events across two days, including Testing the Strength of Jellies, Geodisic Domes and more. Michael McCreary of the Irish Astronomical Society was here for Library Labs: Astronomy Week, with his talk Our Place in the Solar System.
- Both World Book Day and International Womens' Day were marked with a Write Your Own Story workshop for kids, and a talk by historian Cathy Scuffil on women voting for the first time in a General Election, respectively. For Seachtain na Gaeilge, we had a bilingual storytime for preschoolers and an Irish for Beginners class is due to start in late-March.
- Our Foraging and Land-Based Skills Programme, featuring Feebee Foran and Aoife Munn, is well underway with a Local Area Foraging Walk (pictured below) and an upcoming talk, Finding Magic & Medicine in Your Garden.
- Our St Patrick's Day Watercolours for Adults workshops have just finished, with some stunning work being created and we are celebrating Easter with two events for children: a Storytime & Crafts (25th) and a Bingo (27th) and an exhibition for adults, The John Mullen Collection, a postal history view of the 1916 Easter Rising.

- We will be hosting a workshop for children on **Creative Mindfulness** on the 6th.
- Our Foraging and Land-Based Skills programme will continue with a workshop for secondary schools from Feebee Foran on Starting a Herb Garden (9th) and a talk on Making Your Own Natural Beauty Products (23rd).
- Castletymon Library has arranged a programme of events forPoetry Day Ireland (25th) that will be taking place across Castletymon, Ballyroan and Clondalkin Libraries, where our resident book clubs will read a poetry collection for April and get a visit/reading from the poet! Rosamund Taylor will be visiting Castletymon's Book Club on the 8th, Jessica Traynor will be visiting Ballyroan's Book Club on the 25th and Brian Kirk will be visiting Clondalkin's Book Club, also on the 25th, which is Poetry Day Ireland itself.
- Our new series of Computer Classes begins on 12th March and continues for five weeks.
- As part of Library Labs: Eco Week, we will be hosting a Recyclable Seed Paper Workshop for adults (15th) as well as a Book Swop on the 20th. For Library Labs: Tech Week, our events include a talk on Demystifying AI (16th) and three Coding Bracelet workshops with Anyone4Science, including one aimed at neurodiverse children.
- Historian Cathy Scuffil returns in April with a muchanticipated talk, One Photo, Many Stories, which traces the people of one photo from South Dublin Libraries' SOURCE Digital Archive (24th).
- At the end of the month, we will be hosting Healthy Food Made Easy, a course presented in conjunction with South Dublin County Partnership, which continues for 6 weeks.
