# April at NCL

April was a very busy month in North Clondalkin Library. In total **over 120 library-organised events** took place.

## ADULT EDUCATION: Communiversity

- The AONTAS STAR Awards recognise inspiring adult, community and further education initiatives across Ireland.
- The Communiversity programme won the AONTAS STAR Award 2024 in the Third Level Access and Engagement Category. The programme is run by The Clondalkin Access Network (CAN) in partnership with Maynooth University and North Clondalkin Library. It introduces participants to third level subjects in an informal setting and is very well attended.

## Special Projects: Louder Voices

- **Louder Voices** is a collaborative songwriting project which gives teenagers an outlet for whatever they're struggling with / passionate about through providing them with the skills, experience, and the platform to express this through the art of songwriting. The aim is to give the teenagers a **Louder Voice**, for them to feel like they're being heard. There is no musical experience required.


- Lucan Library has 2 public events to celebrate Eco Week, as part of South Dublin Libraries' Library Labs:

## Mobile Libraries Highlights
