Wednesday 25th September: Inclusive Dance Class.




September Highlights: Culture Night and Dublin Climate Action Week

- A Forgotten Polish Hero of the Great Irish Famine Exhibition from National Museum of Ireland (September 16th- October 25th)

Count Paul (Paweł) Strzelecki was a world-renowned Polish explorer and scientist, who volunteered to work in Ireland to combat raging Famine over a three-year period (1847-49) as the main agent of the British Relief Association (B.R.A). It is estimated he saved the lives of as many as 200 000 children during that time.

My Open Library @ Lucan Library

South Dublin County Council's first My Open Library (MOL) will be launched on Saturday 28th September from 11am in Lucan Library. Lucan Library is closed on 23rd and 24th September to facilitate essential works for the service.

- The MOL service offers extended opening hours by providing library access to members from 8 a.m. to 10 p.m., seven days per week, 365 days of the year.
- MOL is an unstaffed self-service library, outside of regular opening hours.
- With MOL you can borrow and return items, print, photocopy, use the internet, access Wifi and use our study spaces.
- You must register in person for MOL and you must take part in an induction. The induction will point out the self-services available during unstaffed hours, and will demonstrate the safety procedures in place.
- MOL membership is available to members aged 16 and over. Parents or guardians must be present to register members aged 16 and 17.
- Inductions for MOL will take place from mid-October in Lucan Library and continue on an ongoing basis.



September at Palmerstown Library

- On each Saturday in September, the library will host a children's event, including arts and crafts, Lego workshops and Musical Tots.
- Other children's events include regular story time, a new Junior Book Club and a new Young Adult Book Club which is in collaboration with Palmerstown Community School.
- Events for adults include the monthly Reading Circle, Family Tree History Research Group, and the Palmerstown Library Book Club.





- Schools service has resumed. It has been expanded to include Fridays ie 4 new DEIS schools will receive a service every 4 weeks.
- Weekend events for August are Glenshane Community Day, Adamstown Community Day and The Colour run in Tymon Park.
- Little Library Bags were distributed at our Early Learning Centre visits and Summer camp visits.
- Two new public stops will be introduced from September in 2 new areas, Seven Mills and St Edmund's Square.
