

We also hosted a launch event Brickcon on 6th September, which featured the Mayor, and are hosting an exhibit in branch until 11th October.

Mobile Libraries Highlights

• Public stops. The two new stops at St Edmunds and Seven Mills are attracting lots of interest. Our timetable is usually set from October for the winter months so there will be one more change to include the Ukranian village at Stonewell. Footfall for public stops is as its highest presently.

•Schools. The schools service now operates five mornings per week with seven new schools added to the schedule. The Fridays have greatly increased our ability to provide to more children. We have an author going out during CBF to one of our schools.

•Outreach. Our last weekend park day finished up on Sat 7th Sept with the outdoor cinema event at Firhouse Community centre. We have been asked to a Christmas market on Sunday 8th Dec and to a few other weekend events that are coming up in October to Dec but are still in the planning. We recently collaborated with Ballyroan Library to promote library services to a nearby traveller community in Owendoher. There was great interaction with the residents helped by the beautiful weather.

•ELCs and Special needs services. The bookings for this type of specialised visit continue to grow having been established and nurtured over the last two years.

•Deliveries. Thanks for bearing with us. The drivers have been working very hard to cover as much as they can and have done a very good job keeping on top of things.
