

Looking forward to in November

Science is a big thing this month with our Season of Science events. We'll have a STEAM Day with Rediscovery Centre on 8th November where they'll be delivering workshops on Climate Heroes and Sustainable Living. As Creatives will be here with all things Regeneration on 11th November with three workshops on Saving Planet Earth! and Regeneration Journeys. The Nutty Scientists will be here on 12th with an event for neurodiverse children, The Ice Age Show. We will also have our monthly STEAM for those with additional needs session, which this month is on making Fake Snow!

Season of Science also has plenty to look forward to for adults with author Richard Nairn talking about restoration and his book Future Wild on 13th, living legend Don Conroy will be here with a talk, Drawn to Nature, on 14th and a Natural Dye Eco-Printing Workshop on 16th.

Our talks for adults this month includes Only a Soldier Knows, where author and soldier Ray Lane will be interviewed about his memoir of the same name by soldier and historian Michael J Whelan on 18th, as well as, on the 27th, a talk with author David Burke who will be here discussing his new book, The Puppet Masters: How MI6 Masterminded Ireland's Deep State Crisis.





Mobile Libraries Highlights

The mobile library service had almost 4,000 visitors to its public stops in September, in addition to 20 school visits and 96 Library @ Home Deliveries.

A new stop at the Ukrainian modular housing at Stonewell, Lucan has been hugely popular, with 120 people signing up for library membership on the first day, and an average of 95 people borrowing books each week since.

During the October mid-term break, the mobile library has attended Hallowe'en camps at Knockmitten Community Centre, and the Park Community Centre, Firhouse, as well as visiting the cadets at Casement Aerodrome, where over 50 signed up for library membership.
