

N4 Jn4 FOOTPATH-CYCLEWAY

South Dublin County Council (SDCC), in conjunction with Transport Infrastructure Ireland (TII) are working with AtkinsRéalis consulting engineers on a design to facilitate improved pedestrian and cyclist features along the N4 Junction 4.

Background

The proposed scheme is located at N4 Junction 4 and looks at all four legs of the junction. It looks to address the hazardous existing conditions for cyclists in the area, with vehicles exiting the N4 mainline, manoeuvring through the slipway and entering the on-road cycle lane at considerable speeds.

Scheme Objectives

- Identify the potential risks to pedestrians and cyclists
- Develop potential solutions to reduce the risk to pedestrians and cyclists
- Improve pedestrian and cyclist safety

Proposed Design

This scheme looks to extend the off-road cycle track along with a new 3m wide shared space link design between existing footpath and the off-road cycle track. In addition this option will include the installation of bollards along the existing on road cycle lane to create a physical barrier. Further measures include the restoration of the red surfacing at the on-road cycle lane.

The proposed works in this scheme will all remain within the existing road boundary - no land take will be necessary.

Next Steps

Following public consultation, and the conclusion of the Section 38 process, the detailed design of the 'N4 Jn4 Footpath-cycleway' will commence, with construction anticipated to start in Q3/Q4 2024
