The Night Belongs to Us

The Night Belongs to Us is a performance events programme for young musicians and DJs aged between 14 – 18. It has returned in 2025 with monthly events in The Civic Theatre, Áras Chrónáin, and Griffeen Youth Centre in Lucan. As of 15th April, 238 young people have attended 6 events featuring 47 performers, all aged between 14 and 18. The Night Belongs To Us is funded by South Dublin County Council Arts Office.



NOISE Music runs free DJing, songwriting, music production, and performance programmes for young people aged from 11 to 18 around South Dublin County.



NOISE MUSIC have been working in partnership with Crosscare Lucan Youth Service for several years in the Griffeen Youth Centre in Lucan and are currently running weekly workshops in the centre, and monthly events as part of The Night Belongs To Us.

NOISE Music will be running a 6-week programme in Balgaddy Child and Family Centre in partnership with South Dublin County Partnership It begins on Thursday 24th April and runs until the end of May. They will be working with two groups of children and young people from Balgaddy aged 11 – 12 and 13 – 18.

NOISE Music's programme in Quarryvale CYC, which is part of a new Youth Drop in call The Hangout Hub that is being supported by SDCC Community Dept, DDLETB,

Crosscare Ronanstown Youth Service, and a Creative Ireland South Dublin dance project, has been well attended with 13 members aged from 10 - 13 now participating in weekly songwriting, performance, and DJing workshops. The group will be performing at an event on Thursday 17th April as part of QCYC's Easter Bunny family event.



NOISE Music - Creative Ireland Project Award

NOISE Music received funding from the Creative Ireland Project Award for a collaborative project in the Adamstown area. This project is a series of site-specific performances by young artists that will be filmed and exhibited in Adamstown Youth and Community Centre and on screens in public spaces throughout South Dublin County. The performances will be music, dance, and spoken word pieces – created by young people from Adamstown in collaboration with a team of experienced artist/facilitators led by NOISE Music and Go Dance for Change.

The young performers will also work with an emerging design company Timing GNSL, who are from Adamstown and are active as social entrepreneurs in the community, to create a title and visual identity for the project that will be incorporated into costumes and graphics that will be used in a social media campaign to raise awareness and build an audience for the project.

The project recently launched a call for participants and is accepting applications via https://submit.link/3xV. The deadline for applications is Friday 9th May.
