March Statistics

- Ballyroan Library had 20,642 visitors in February, with 13,571 items issued, and 450 new members registered.
- Castletymon Library had 5446 visitors, with 3287 items issued and 47 newly registered patrons.
- Mobile Libraries had 8218 visitors, with 9022 items issued and 110 newly registered patrons.

Mobile Libraries April Visits & May Highlights

Reflecting on April 2025, we had 0 cancelled stops of 144 public stops welcoming 3989 people to our mobile libraries. We visited 20 schools and brought in an extra school. It is Lir, a small Gaelscoil that currently shares a yard with Rathcoole ETNS. We hope to continue this service after Rathcoole ETNS move to a new location.
