

As part of the Library Labs STEAM programme Clondalkin Library celebrated Biodiversity week from 17th -24th May

On 21st May Brian Murray of the MicroWild project gave a fascinating talk on Irish Bees including an overview of all species of bees found in Ireland with specimens for the audience to view

On 22nd May 2 primary school classes attended a botany workshop facilitated by Anyone 4 Science in which they learned about propagating peas

On 24th May children learned how to make natural perfume bars and lip balm using native irish flowers and plants.

Each Little Library Bag contains two specially chosen picture books as well as information on the transition to big school for children and caregivers.






