## September Stats Ballyroan, Castletymon & Mobile Libraries

Ballyroan library had 101 events attended by 1,670 people, issued 15,313 items, registered 595 new borrowers and had 20,809 visitors.

Castletymon Library had 41 events, issued 3131 items, registered 189 new borrowers and had 6345 visitors.

In September Mobile Libraries issued 9605 items and registered 258 new borrowers. They had 111 public stops with 3047 visitors at these stops

Mobiles visited 22 schools with 8 classes per visit in September and did 84 library@home visits.

- •Regular weekly events continue including Toddler Time, Storytime and Chess and fortnightly Coder Dojo.




#### For Adults:




For Schools

## Red Line Book Festival 2025 -Highlights

The festival celebrated its 14th year in 2025 and took place from 13th - 19th October in libraries and venues all across South Dublin.

The Red Line Family Fun Day remains a significant event in the festival. The day saw over **2,000 people** attend events in Tallaght Library, the Civic theatre and outdoor space in Parthalán Place.

The Illustrator in Residence program saw 15 participants exhibit their work in Ballyroan Library following a 5-week mentorship programe with artist Celina Buckley

The prestigious Red Line bi-lingual poetry competition saw over **500 entries** from all over Ireland, with the winning poem "Schooner" coming from Galway poet James Anthony.









## Festival Highlights

The festival lineup featured a host of national and international authors, while also platforming local and emerging writers.

Bridget Jones creator Helen Fielding spoke to a sold-out audience in Rathfarnham Castle, interviewed by Tallaght native Vicky Notaro.

**Gavan Reilly** and **Jennifer Bray** enthralled a full capacity crowd in Rua Red with tales of Leinster House

Irish language author and advocate **Hector O'Eochagáin** in conversation with presenter **Muireann O'Connell** brought lively banter and laughter to a raucous Civic theatre

The End of the Line: A Spoken Word Celebration featured 10 acclaimed poets from across Ireland in a rousing closing event to the festival









## Accessibility

Irish sign language played an important part in increasing accessibility for this year's festival.

ISL interpretation was provided for 4 main events in the Civic theatre and Rathfarnham Castle.

Feedback for provision of this service was excellent, both from attendees and event participants. We aim to increase the provision of ISL to more events in 2026.





## Engagement and Participation

There were **45** events delivered across **12** venues for the 2025 festival. 17 events **booked out.** 

Total attendance was approx. **5,500** people, a **10% increase** on 2024.

Social media engagement increased by 31% on select channels. Follower numbers increased by 23%.

Media engagement was significant in 2025, with festival coverage appearing in national outlets including Newstalk, the Sunday Independent, the Irish Times, the Journal and RTE.ie
