#### October Stats Ballyroan, Castletymon & Mobile Libraries

Ballyroan library had 129 events attended by 2,397 people, issued 14,913 items and registered 559 new borrowers and had 22,503 visitors. This compares with 21,808 visitors in October 2024.

Castletymon Library had 54 events, issued 3,036 items and registered 992 new borrowers, they had 5699 visitors, this compares to 5677 visitors in 2024.

Mobile Libraries issued 7145 items and registered 53 new borrowers in October. Mobiles visited 21 schools with 8 classes per visit in November, they visited 17 crèches and did 84 library@home visits.






#### For Children:


On 3<sup>rd</sup> December, Anne from Suimhneas will be educating parents and their babies about the world of Baby Reflexology.
